Dutch Language Classes for the English Stream

It is with great pleasure that we announce the logistics and details of the much awaited for Dutch Language Classes at NISL for ES students. These will be offered as an after school activity by juf Danitsa;

- Wednesdays 2.30pm (Years 3-6) – Maximum of 12 children
- Fridays 12.30pm (Rec to Year 2) – Maximum of 10 children
- First come, first served 😊 so sign up fast!!!
- The classes will be hourly and will run for 12 weeks
- Termly fee is N20, 000

Classes begin next week Wednesday 5th and Friday 7th respectively; sign-up for which can take place in the School Office on Monday 3rd/Tuesday 4th.

Just as with ASAs, payment must be made at the time of signing up in order to secure your child's place.

Information Morning

We have traditionally held an information evening at NISL but we now cordially invite you to our first information MORNING. This was something many Parents requested for via our last Parent questionnaire. This is the perfect opportunity to learn more about the curriculum and see the classroom set up. The purpose of the morning is not to have one on one Parent/Teacher Conferences but more so to collectively and informally get a feel of this year (curriculum, expectations, routines etc).

Date; Saturday 8th September
Time; 9.00am – 10.30am

Please note that we had originally publicised a 9.30am start, however, we will start at 9.00am prompt in line with Football and Ballet timings that Saturday.

If your child is not in the Saturday morning Football/Ballet activities we humbly ask that you try to arrange childcare as supervision will be limited. Thank you for your understanding.

Parent Supervision/Playground Safety

Primarily for the safety of your children; we must enforce from the onset some “ground rules” for the academic year. Class Teachers have explained the below bullet points in child speak to the students and we ask you to please reiterate/take note of;

- No play equipment whatsoever should be brought out for use before or after school
- Monday to Thursday; Minimax, Maximax and Pre-Reception children should not play on the main Jungle Gym after having been collected. The traffic circuit is also in use at 12-12.30pm Monday to Thursday with older children playing. We need to protect our youngest and therefore request that going home straight after pick up.
- You are responsible for your child if you arrive before 7.20am (this is when staff duty commences).
- You are responsible for your child after pick up. Staff on duty are at the late pick up bench area only to supervise those who have not been collected on time.
- A recommendation rather than a rule...closed shoes rather than slippers/flip flops are highly recommended for health and safety reasons.
